Grant of Conditional Permission to Parashar Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Zirniya Narsinggard Road, Parvalia, Bhopal-462030, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0362) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24 and relevant regulations thereunder after consideration of your appeal dated 20.09.2023 by the Commission filed against the imposition of monetary penalty of Rs. 3.75 crore -reg.

## Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division(1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under.

Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

- Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Parashar Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Zirniya Narsinggard Road, Parvalia, Bhopal-462030, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0362) inspection of your College was conducted on 22.05.2023 & 23.05.2023 via hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) under Section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24.
- Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under.
- 3. Meanwhile, 15 faculties of your institution namely Dr. Munira Mohd Khizar, Dr. Prashant Mahipati Chormore, Dr. Pritam Vijay Patil, Dr. Vishal R Jadhao, Dr. Amol Balram Karale, Dr. Kiran Bala Solanki, Dr.Amol Dilip Jangale, Dr. Anup Bharat Shinde, Dr. Ashish Prakash Jadhav and Dr. Jaya Singh, Dr. Komal Ketan Patil, Dr. Monisha Raghuwanshi, Dr. Monali B Patil, Dr. Monisa Bharat Ghodake, Dr. Shital Ashokrao Kolpyakwar in the academic year 2023-24 were proven to be physically absent but working only on paper teacher and accordingly a penalty of Rupees 3.75 Crore was imposed on your institution vide letter no. Teacher Verification/MARB/2023 dated 25.08.2023 and after reducing the 15 proven physically absent but present only on paper teachers, denial of conditional permission was issued to you vide even no. dated 19.09.2023.
- 4. In view of the above decision, you have filed the first appeal vide letter ref. PAMC/2023/1390 dated 20.09.2023 in the Commission. Thereafter, the said appeal was placed before the Chairman, NCISM and Chairman NCISM constituted a Hearing Committee to provide an opportunity of hearing to you. Accordingly, the letter was sent to you vide Commission's letter dated 11.10.2023 to appear before the designated hearing committee on 12.10.2023 in respect of the appeal filled by you and the proceedings of appeal were held virtually on 12.10.2023 at 02:00 PM and on-behalf of the college Mr. Anoop Chaturvedi, Director and Dr. Abhay, Vice Principal attended the hearing. Teacher Verification/MARB/2023 dated 25.08.2023.

Mohd Khizar, Dr. Prashant Mahipati Chormore, Dr. Pritam Vijay Patil, Dr. Vishal R Jadhao, Dr. Amol Balram Karale, Dr. Kiran Bala Solanki, Dr. Amol Dilip Jangale, Dr. Anup Bharat Shinde, Dr. Ashish Prakash Jadhav and Dr. Jaya Singh, Dr. Komal Ketan Patil, Dr. Monisha Rahuwanshi, Dr. Monali B Patil, Dr. Monisa Bharat Ghodake, Dr. Shital Ashokrao Kolpyakwar are regular faculty of our institute. And they all are present on the day of visitation on dated 22.05.23 and 23.05.2023 and verified by all the 3 visitors.

All above mentioned faculties verified their presence during visitation and signed annexure- 1 in front of visitors.

Institute have total 3HF in the department in which 1 prof and 2 reader and on the day of visitation Dr. Amol Balram karale (AYKC00331) (Principal and prof kayachikitsa) represents the institute. Dr Shital Kolpayakwar (AYKC02307) was also present on the day of visit and Dr Attek Ahmed appointed in the month of June 2023. The department fulfils the norms.

 There are no available faculties in the department of Kriya Sharir, Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana, Prasuti Tantra & Stri Roga. Dr Prashant Mahipathi Chormore (AYKS00744) (reader) and Dr Komal Ketan Patel (AYKS01119) (lecturer) both faculties were present on the day of visitation., department full fills the norms

Dr Vishal R Jadav (AYRB00340) (reader) and Dr Jaya Singh (AYRB01747) (lecturer) both faculties were present on the day of visitation. Department fulfils the norms.

There is shortcoming of 1 Lower Faculty in the department of Shalya Tantra and Shalakya Tantra and Availability of Total Teaching Faculty after considering the Dr Ashish Prakash Jadava (AYPS00742) (reader) and Dr Monisa Bharat Ghodke (AYST02101) (lecturer) both faculties were present on the day of visitation, department

- 5. Further, keeping in view of the facts during hearing, Hearing Committee recommends to consider the appeal filed by you dated 20.09.2023 and accordingly a letter vide ref. no. NCISM/Comm. /OPT. Appeal/ (2023-24)-(M.P.) dated 19.10.2023 has been received from the Secretary, NCISM wherein it has been decided by the Chairman, NCISM to consider the appeal of Parashar Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Zirniya Narsinggard Road, Parvalia, Bhopal-462030, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0362) against the imposition of monetary penalty of Rs. 3.75 crore in respect of appointing physically absent but present only on-paper teacher.
- 6. Therefore, as per the direction received from the Commission, NCISM and on the basis of the affidavit no. BS843649 dated 12.10.2023 submitted by the complainant for withdrawal of complaint, Grant of Conditional Permission is issued to Parashar Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Zirniya Narsinggard Road, Parvalia, Bhopal-462030, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0362) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and college shall be fulfilling the following requirements:-
  - The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
  - II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
  - III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 8. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or subsequent year.
- 9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 10. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2024-2025:-
  - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
  - ii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda).
  - iii) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
- 11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
